With black glass and soft finishes, Cohen exposes a world of ominous visions. Images from his black-and-white dreams are his subject matter, creating a landscape of work that is breathtaking, eerie, and strangely familiar.

Born and raised in New York City, Cohen is breaking his way into the center of the contemporary glass scene. For an extensive/intensive 16 years of instruction in glass craft, Cohen studied under such notable glass artists as Jeremy Lepisto, Deborah Horrell, and Jiyong Lee. In 2007 he did post-batch work at Tsinghua University in Beijing, China under Professor Wang Zhang Zong. Cohen has been involved in several workshops at Pilchuck Glass School as a student, staff, teaching assistant, and visiting artist's assistant. He currently lives and works in Healdsburg, CA.
